HOW OFTEN AND WHEN DO TROOPS MEET?

Most Girl Scout troops meet one or two times per month, and the day and time depends on the troop!

WHERE DO TROOPS MEET?

Girl Scout troops typically meet in homes, clubhouses, libraries, and places of worship. Many troops also conduct virtual meetings.

WHAT DO GIRLS DO AT THE MEETINGS?

During troop meetings, girls learn leadership and friendship skills through our badge programs! We have a variety of badges so each girl can explore their own interests.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Annual membership dues to GSUSA are \$25 and uniforms typically cost around \$30. Financial assistance is available.
